#### Bobby Bragan spent seven decades in professional baseball

- Broke in with Philadelphia. Traded to the Brooklyn Dodgers in 1943
  - With the Dodgers when Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier
- Managed the Pirates, Indians and Braves
  - Coached with the Dodgers (L.A.) and Colt 45s
  - Managed various minor league clubs including the Ft. Worth Cats
- Front Office Executive
  - President of the Texas League
  - President of the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues
  - Texas Rangers Front Office

#### **Background**

The Bobby Bragan Youth Foundation (BBYF) is celebrating over 30 years of awarding college scholarship to outstanding students

- 22 independent school districts across the Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex
- 150 public schools
- Over 40,000 students eligible for consideration
- Competitive application process
- Academics, Extracurricular Activities and Community Service
- New endowed scholarship for specifically for deaf students

## BBYF chooses to award the promise of a college scholarship – not to high school seniors – but to students when they are in the 8th grade

- A BBYF scholarship provides students the incentive to do well in high school, graduate, and continue on to college
- The foundation believes that by focusing on the availability of aid for merit at the middle school level, students and their families will be inspired to plan for higher education and will dedicate themselves to work hard to reach that goal, and will be motivated to seek out additional aid at an earlier stage in their lives



# 1991-2023 Over 900 scholarship recipients

The BBYF has awarded more than \$2,200,000 in college scholarships as of spring 2022.

Over ninety-eight percent of BBYF scholarship winners have enrolled in an institution of higher learning following graduation from high school.








## Player Of The Week Program

Baylor senior designated hitter Matt Menard was named the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger of the Week. Menard had a .533 average (8-for-13) with two doubles and a home run in games from March 13-19.



Bragan Award: Texas Tech infielder/outfielder Tanner Gardner has been selected as the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award Player of the Week. Gardner hit .600 (9 for 15) with four doubles and three RBIs over the week.



Choruby Earns Bragan Award Player of the Week Recognition

**COLLEGE STATION, Texas --** Texas A&M outfielder Nick Choruby was selected as the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award Player of the Week as announced by the Bobby Bragan Youth Foundation (BBYF).

Choruby was honored for a week in which he batted .500 (8-for-16) with two home runs and three RBI as he helped the Aggies to a 3-1 record in four road games. The senior entered the week with one career home run and left it with three as he hit dingers in consecutive games at Texas State on Tuesday and No. 8 LSU on Thursday.

The Portland, Oregon-native started the week by going 3-for-4 with three runs, one walk, one home run and one RBI at Texas State. His dinger in the fourth inning cut the Bobcats' lead to 3-1 and start a string of nine unanswered runs. His two-run home run in the fifth inning gave the Aggies a lead in their 4-0 victory over LSU in the series opener.

On the season, Choruby is hitting .313 with 30 runs, four doubles, three triples, 15 RBI and seven stolen bases. He boasts a .446 on-base percentage.

This season, the BBFY launched the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award, an honor that takes into account the performance at the plate, academics and personal integrity of the hitters from the 21 NCAA Division I baseball programs in the state of Texas.
